Pawlowski was a councilman for 3 years, but did not seek election last year. He is the owner of Pride Landscape Supply in South Amboy. Grobelny, retired from DuPont's, is a former Sayreville Fire Chief, and served as Zoning Board Chairman for several years. He is currently employed by Sherwin-Williams in East Brunswick.

Pawlowski and Grobelny will be seeking the two council seats presently held by Republicans Vincent Zarcaro Jr. and Frank Makransky.

21 Years Of Music, Mirth And Mayhem

Baseball's "Iron Man," Cal Ripken retired at the end of the 2001 season. South Amboy native, Henry Conroy Jr., is somewhat an "Iron Man" in his own right. The popular local DJ is celebrating his 21st Anniversary in the entertainment business. He has been flipping records, tapes, and CD's, as well as entertaining pub patrons with his fun-filled and zany antics on the local scene since 1981.

Conroy, who grew up on David St. near Protection Fire House, played in the South Amboy Little League, and also for St. Mary's 8th grade basketball team. While a member of the grammar school team, he traveled to play a game at the shore. "Biff" McKeon came to help our coach, George

Daley, and as we were driving to the game, Little Richard came on the radio singing "Tutti Frutti," and that was it! I've seen him 5 times," said Conroy, recalling how he fell in love with music.

"Henny" was an All-American type of student at St. Mary's High. Always a talented athlete, he was captain of the varsity basketball team, played baseball, and was elected President of the Student Council. "It was an honor. Charlie Schachel (who played baseball only) was the best athlete in the school," he said. "My twin brother was St. Mary's top pitcher in his junior and senior years," recalled Henny.

In a letter to Tom O'Leary, Chairman of the South Amboy Democratic Organization, she mentioned growing responsibilities on her job as a Purchasing Manager, and expects them to double next year, which would "leave little time to work efficiently as a Councilperson for the city."

Samuelson thanked all the people who supported her over the last 8 years, and said, "I will certainly miss working with the Mayor and Council."

Budget Wins In Sayreville

The \$55 million Sayreville school budget for 2002-03 was passed by a 1,672-1,272 margin by voters. An average homeowners taxes will increase by \$108.

Re-elected to the Board of Education were top vote-getter, Arthur Rittenhouse Jr. with 1,722 votes, Joseph Bera III 1,663, and Ronald VanTine 1,579. John "Jack" Myatt tallied 1,229 votes.

McCarthy, Kern, Rodriguez Elected In SA

Michael McCarthy, Janet Kern, and newcomer Christie Rodriguez were elected to the South Amboy Board of Education. McCarthy notched the most votes with 378, followed by Kern 346, and Rodriguez 297.

Local voters rejected the \$13.7 million Board of Education budget for 2002-03, by a 462-168 margin. Taxes would have been increased by \$114 for the average homeowner if it was passed.

A plan to purchase 52 computers to use throughout the district at a cost of \$100,000, was defeated, 477-129. Also, a question for restroom renovations at the elementary school for \$250,000 was nixed by a 479-122 margin.



Local Woman Has Vintage Yankee Autographs

South Amboy resident, Lillian Nardone was a huge baseball fan as a youngster. Growing up in Madison, NJ with 7 brothers, it was a natural thing for her to listen to all the New York Yankee games on the radio. "I kept score of every game while listening," she said.

Lillian loved the Yankees, and her oldest brother was supposed to play for them but was seriously injured.

In 1936, she heard about Babe Ruth's All Star team, and filled out a list with her version as to who were the best players. She sent her selections to Joe McCarthy, manager of the Yanks, and he sent back a piece of paper dated June 3, 1936 with autographs of all his players including Yankee legends, Lou Gehrig, rookie Joe DiMaggio, Frank Crosetti, and Red Rolfe to name a few. "Back then, I was ecstatic. I had to show everybody," Lillian said.

One of her fondest baseball memories is when she was at Yankee Stadium with her brothers when Lou Gehrig gave his legendary historical speech.

When she got older, she gave the Yankee autographs and letter to her brother Mike. He kept it for years and gave it to his son, who this past Christmas returned it to Nardone. "I was so surprised!" Everyone at dinner had to look at it and read the letter," she said.


Lillian also kept a baseball scrapbook with clippings from the 1930's. It is also in excellent condition. She would like to get her vintage sports memorabilia appraised. Her son, Dennis, who was one of the greatest third basemen in St. Mary's baseball history, was a member of the '69 state championship team, and was selected All-County 1st team and All State, commented on her collectables; "I think it's very historical, especially from the standpoint that it was DiMaggio's rookie season, and Lou Gehrig also signed his autograph.

"Today, I'm a Met fan. I flip the stations," said Lillian.

Theresa Check was Majorette. . .

At graduation time, "I Can't Stop Loving You" by Ray Charles was the #1 song in the nation. Sayreville's Class of '62 had 155 graduates. Delia Jones was the Valedictorian, Mary Romanski was Salutatorian, and Peter P. O'Such Jr. was Terterian. .

Her husband Bruce is also a grad of HHS, c/o 1950, and runs Architectural Materials business. Her family recollections in the SA school system spans a century.

The couple's 3 sons, Bruce the oldest is a SA Police Sergeant from c/o '75, Chris is an Aerospace Engineer, and Steven a Ceramic Engineer (Rutgers). All three are Hoffman grads.

Anne & Bruce are also proud grandparents of 8 grandchildren, and two, Kevin & Jennifer are grads of HHS. Jenny is attending the Culinary Institute of America. In addition, three great-grand kids, Matthew & Kimberly are attending SA Elementary School, and Bryan will be entering kindergarten there in Sept. 

Fishing Flashes

The Fluke (Summer Flounder) regulations for 2002 have been finalized. The season will begin on May 18 and continue to Sept. 24. Bag limit remains at 8 fish, but size limit goes up an inch to 16 inches. Most of the party boats were behind this middle of the line compromise, as pushing the size limit to 17 inches would only give us a few more days to comply with the new formula, as we supposedly over-fished last year's poundage. Beach action for striped bass is good at local SA and Cliffwood Beaches with clams the bait to use. Fish up to 20 pounds have been caught and the bay is loaded with bunkers. Flounder action is good down below, but up here it's just a good pick at best. Offshore, the mackerel stayed here all winter long, so go fishing now, its good and this just might be our spring run. Ling and a few big blackfish continue to be caught and even some whiting-these long lost fish have made a few appearances.

Opening Day Trout season was April 13th at 8 a.m. Plenty of fish were on hand, so it looks like another good season despite the drought. A very few shad are going up the Delaware River. This year's shad run doesn't look that good overall.

Fire Destroys Two-Family Home

At 5:30 p.m. on April 1st, a windswept, fast-moving fire swept through a two-family home on Wilmont Street in South Amboy. The entire structure was gutted, and one firefighter said that, "it was the biggest house fire we've had in South Amboy in several years."

Kevin Sinka said he was cleaning the garage with his son, while his sister-in-law

was cooking in the kitchen, and his niece and daughter were on the front porch sewing. There was a lit candle on the porch, and "apparently a window was open, and the curtain blew and caught fire. In 5 minutes, the whole thing was blown apart," said Sinka. The second floor family of three was not at home when the fire started.

Over 120 local South Amboy and Sayreville firefighters, first aiders, and emergency workers battled the stubborn blaze. According to South Amboy Fire

Chief Larry Parsons,"Firefighter Ted Huff was treated for smoke inhalation." Sinka said that his sister-in-law suffered facial and hair burns.

In an exclusive interview with The SA Times, Sinka noted that "It was a 5 minute fire of destruction. By me kicking the doors open to look for people, it caused a wind draft. It was very windy that day. Our neighbor, Ted Mroczkowski was immediately there with a hose on the porch trying to put out the fire," he said. Sinka

also stated that after an investigation,"the Fire Marshall closed it as an accident."

This was the first house fire I ever witnessed close-up, and it was a very sad and scary experience. You never realize how brave and important our local firefighters and first aid members from South Amboy and Sayreville are until it comes this close to home. Their compassion and dedication to helping their fellow human beings is a true blessing. Thank







cannot speak for themselves, I am typing to do just that. I ask you to please say NO to the following; 1.A fur coat-forget the myths about the "glamour," think about the 60 or more animals it took to make that coat. They suffered excruciating pain in steel jaw leg-hold traps for hours or even days. They chew off their own feet to escape the pain. Those "ranched" or bred for wearable fur are kept in tiny, dirty cages for months, then electrocuted, poisoned, suffocated and possibly skinned alive. No matter how nice that fur looks, you should see where it's been. 2.vealcalves (babies) are tethered by the neck in crates 2 ft. wide. Unable to exercise, turn around, or even lie down comfortably. This confinement is intended to make the calves' meat "tender." Their diet is severely limited, and all liquid milk substitute (causes severe diarrehea) purposely deficient in iron and fiber, causing anemia and the pale colored flesh. These are babies, please stop buying veal. 3.premarin-mares 4 months pregnant are put in stalls & fitted with catheters and 'pee bags." These are strapped to mares haunches and often chafe their legs. These pregnant mares spend the next 7 months in these stalls. They receive 5 gallons water daily, 1/3 their normal intake, so the urine will be highly concentrated. After giving birth, just around now, they are allowed 2 months with their foals to wean them. Most of the foals are sold for slaughter (more than 65,000 annually). By October, the mares are pregnant again an back in the stall. This goes on for 10 years or more and then the mares are sold to slaughter. Estrogen can now be manufactured inexpensively, so why torture these poor animals where there is a hidden ingredient-cruelty! I now ask you to say YES to spay/neuter your pet. Spring Is In The Air: So Put Your Fat On The Run

After a winter of sloth and over-eating, you may be facing a tough road to get into shape. And now with spring coming on fast, summer and swimsuit season, you might be feeling a sense of panic as you stand before the mirror. But before you drop that remote and spring into exercise overdrive, a word of advice: EASE INTO IT.

If stemming that southward migration of flab is your top priority, Nick DiNubile, M.D. warns against crash dieting. Defined as any weight loss program in which you lose more than about a pound a week. Chances are if you're losing more than that, a lot of it is water, which will come back, and muscle which you don't want to have lost at all, because muscles help you burn calories.

If you've been relatively sedentary this winter, it means you're now out of shape, which means weaker muscles and tendons that are far more vulnerable to sprains and strains than when you were intop shape last fall. Avoidover training injuries by working into fitness.

If you would like to start a walking or running program, for example, start off by walking 1-mile at an easy pace before increasingthe speed. As a rule of thumb, never increase the amount of exercise you do by more than 10% a week. This rule applies equally to the number of repetitions or amount of weight you

As you rehabilitate your outdoor activity program, don't forget about your skin. Dig out that bottle of sunscreen and dust off that hat before heading back out in the sun. Also rememberto increase your fluid intake in warmer

You should not exercise if you're sick or injured, but keep to a regular schedule of physical activity. 30 minutes of exercise, three times a week is a good goal. If you miss a session, don't try to make it up with an extra hard workout. Just pick up where you left off.

Music is Teresa's biggest hobby, and she had a wonderful time at Branson, Missouri, where she met country music stars Ray Stevens, Mickey Gilley, Boxcar Willie, and the great Bobby Vinton. "Bobby threw his hat off the stage, and I caught it, and he signed it," she proudly recalled.

On a trip to Savannah, Georgia, she saw the bench that was used in the "Forest Gump" movie. On another trip to Montana, she saw the bridge from the same movie. "In Tennessee, I saw where country music star Alan Jackson lived. We saw his white horse."

Conroy attended Belmont Abby College, where he hoped to play basketball, but they had no freshmen or JV teams. The legendary Al McGuire was the coach, and they went to the Final 4. After college graduation, he began teaching at his alma mater, St. Mary's High, and also became the JV basketball coach. In '67 after 3 years at the school, he went into the US Army and was a drill sergeant at Ft. Campbell, Kentucky. Following his 2-year hitch with Uncle Sam, he returned to the educational field in the Woodbridge Schools system, where he also coached the 9th grade Avenel basketball team from 1972-81. He retired from the teaching profession in September 2001 after 32 years in Woodbridge

Back in the early 1970's, "Henny" was looking for something to do during summer vacation, so he ventured into the hot dog business and started Hot Dog City, a pushcart-type hot dog stand which featured delicious Sabrett hot dogs, and the coldest soda around. Located in front of Ploskonka's Shoemakers and across the street from Madura's Pharmacy, on Broadway, Hot Dog City quickly became a big hit with local shoppers and townsfolk. Conroy has many fond memories of those days. "Gary Lange, to this day holds the record for eating the most hot dogs 6, and drinking the most sodas," he said.

In 1979, the versatile and talented Conroy, who could play "a little guitar and piano" was asked by the principal of Avenel Junior High to be the DJ at a semi-formal. This was a major moment in "Henny's" life, as it started him on the road to his DJ career which he loves so much. "He gave me money to buy music, so I bought those big 45's that had disco on one side and rock on the other. I really enjoyed it," said Conroy. So did the students. He continued performing at the junior high dances for 3 years.

"Henny The DJ" went big-time in May 1981, when he did his first "official" bar gig at English's Pub (presently Harbor Lights). He remembers one person who made him feel accepted, "Johnny Dragotta came over and asked how I was doing, and said I sounded good. He bought me a beer and calmed me down. That meant a lot to me. We've been friends for a long time."

Conroy has had a phenomenal run as the headlining DJ in local bars. Talk about a streak, try this one on for size. On May 18th, "Henny The DJ" will mark his 18th Anniversary for playing in the same bar- The Landmark. That's 18 consecutive years, (or 936 shows), every weekend without missing! What a feat! Talk about dedication! The same weekend, is the 21st Anniversary of Dee Jaying in bars in the same town-South Amboy. He has performed every single weekend for 21 years, (1,092 shows), and the streak was only temporarily halted for a week when the Lions Den burned down!

His accomplishments as a DJ have not gone unnoticed. In 1994, he had a photo and feature story about him in "Nightclub & Bar,"a national magazine, and his "Iron Man" streaks are being considered by The Guiness World Book of Records.

"Henny The DJ" attributes many rea-


sons for his success. "I've discovered Zydco music (New Orleans accordion), wear lots of costumes, I do gimmicks, Seinfeld and Rock 'N' Roll trivia, a limbo contest, but most importantly it's getting to know people and being accessible. Also, not being afraid to have a good time and do stupid things yourself. You have to learn to be yourself, and that's not easy," he said. Henny's assistant, "The Tambourine Lady," Jay Osinski does an excellent job singing and dancing. "She really gets people involved," said Conroy.

'Henny" is a most entertaining performer, who hopes to one day be remembered as, "Somebody that tried to help people have a good time." "Henny The DJ" has certainly done that and so much more for locals over the years. "I thank God everyday for the health of my wife and daughter," said the veteran DJ.

Henny Facts & Trivia-He truly loves South Amboy people, whom he calls "the greatest in the world. I've done a lot of events for the fireman over the years, and they are the very best," he said. . . 2 bars that he worked in burned down. Lions Den in South Amboy (the last song he played the night before the fire was "Burning Down The House," "no lie", said Henny. The Main Street Tavern in Keansburg also burned...He once got fired in the middle of a gig in a Perth Amboy bar because he couldn't agree to work there on St. Patrick's Day...He worked a girl's wedding shower where there were 100 women, and he was the only man. . . Worked at The French Quarter Hotel pool parties in Ocean City, Maryland. . . Worked at the following SA bars; Lions Den, English's Pub, Landmark, The Dugout, The Bottle Stop, and the South Amboy Pub before it was the South Amboy Pub. . . Henny actually deejayed in the Bottle Stop in '75 for about 3 months before he started for real in 1981... .His biggest thrill as a DJ was performing at a wedding with The Lynch Boys, a shore group he idolized. . . In the early '90's, Conroy once worked on St. Patrick's Day at O'Hara's, 2 blocks from the World Trade Center. It was destroyed in the terrorist attack on 9-11. . . He will be working in Canada this summer with professional wrestlers. . . Henny affectionately calls people "Holmes," an expression he got from local hoops legend, Jerry Drill. "I could never beat him in 1-on1 in basketball," said Conroy. . . Reading is one of his favorite hobbies.







The complex located on the corner of Washington Road and Margaret Street in Parlin, was established in 1952 by Robert Buchanan and Mickey Sedlak. At that time, the league consisted of six teams and one baseball diamond.

In the late 1950's or early 60's, a second field was added and a few years after that, the third field. . . New Station Remains On Track

Planning continues for the new South Amboy train station project. Plans call for high-level platforms, a 1000 car parking deck and a plaza connecting Broadway to

The new plaza will include an elevator system and a new stairway allowing pedestrians to cross over the tracks. The project is funded by a \$2.5 million grant from the federal Transportation Equity Act. Eventually, the access way will connect to a high level platform, the final piece of NJ Transit's \$18 million train station renova-

Alongside the plaza, a 10,000 square foot office building is planned.

NJ Transit officials say the plaza, pedestrian overpass and high-level platforms are still being designed. The overpass will be built first probably this summer. The new station is designed with architectural features circa 1900 to blend with South Amboy's downtown. The first phase of the station upgrade was finished last year when an old rail yard was converted into a 244 space parking lot.


